Dr. Dwight J. Hotchkiss, Jr. of South Carolina has donated a book he and his brother, Robert authored about their father, Dwight, Sr. It tells of Dwight Sr.'s tragedy of losing his hearing during his freshman year in college due to meningitis and his triumph through adversity. Joan Johnson will bring a copy to the August 2015 reunion.

Helen Schatvet Ullmann, CG, FASG is compiling a book on her Smiths of Naugatuck, CT. Several married Hotchkiss'. On page 423 of Vol 2—Joshua, Anson Smith's wife is listed as Esther Atkins, this is an error. His wife was Sarah Bouton. Helen has published information on the Bouton family in The American Genealogist. Helen is also trying to identify a Sally Hotchkiss who married Edward A. Smith. If you have any information about Smith-Hotchkiss marriages please contact Joan Johnson, HFA Genealogist.

Julie Greicius wrote with a correction to the spelling of Anna Aline Stone, her great grandmother. She is incorrectly listed as Anna Salme Stone. She married Samuel Stone Hotchkiss in 1894. She cites sources; NY Times, 24 Oct 1894 Obituary Record of Yale Graduates on Mocavo.com. Anna died in 1905. Samuel Hotchkiss remarried later that year to Helen L'Hommideau.

David Johnson reports that Albert J Hotchkiss on the 'Daniel' line, is the son of Rev Velona Hotchkiss and Sabrina Powers. A Rochester NY Democrat & Chronicle article reports that a prison mate of Albert's, Sgt Charles Moody arrived at Albert's father's home telling of Albert's death 4 months earlier on Aug. 23, 1864. Sgt Moody kept a diary of every man in his regiment including the date of each man's death. Moody was a native of Rochester.

Christina Hancock is looking for proof that Horace Hotchkiss b. 16 Apr 1840 So. Valley, Cattaraugus Co., NY married Louisa Hill(?). They are the parents of Charles Hotchkiss who was later adopted by Charles Mighells (sometimes incorrectly referred to as Charles Miles). Charles Hotchkiss Mighells kept his adoptive parents last name and passed it on to his children. Edwin, one of his children had 4 children: Ann, James, Edwin and Joyce. Editor's note: Other families have used this approach to sort out & differentiate the different family lines, for instance from Samuel's sons and those Hotchkiss' still 'across the pond'.

According to their website, 90% of genealogists choose Family Tree DNA – with the largest DNA database. We have at least one person in the DNA project for each of Samuel's sons but need more male descendants of Joshua, Samuel and Thomas to step up.

Notes from Joan Johnson, HFA Genealogist

“Heads Up” to cousins that some family identification numbers have been changed so they will want to check with the John book, if they order one, to make corrections to their records. In many cases we didn't have birthdates, only guesstimates, so when the birth dates were found and entered into the records, the FTM program arranged the children by birthdates, which caused the numbering changes. Since our system is based on the child's place within the family, I decided numbers should be changed. It's made a lot of work but will make it easier for future researchers.

I'm checking the family and descendants of Harris

Hotchkiss #123-21 (Charles, Joshua, Joshua, John, Samuel) whose family was so mixed up that it wasn't till 10 years ago, or so, when we began hearing from descendants of his daughter Malinda (Hotchkiss) Bailey that we began to get it in order. Linda Bailey, in 2005, sent a huge packet of material, 90% I judge, from the family bible, vital records, etc. It's been a slow process, but we're finally seeing the light at the end of the tunnel.

Donald Leroy Hotchkiss, 84 of Sierra Vista passed away June 28, 2014 in Las Vegas, NV. 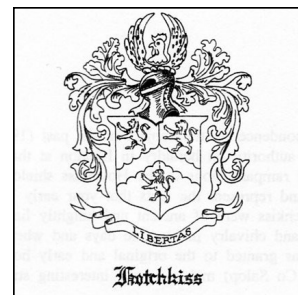

7. **Caleb Matthews** (Elizabeth Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1703.³ He d 1786 at the age of 83.³

Caleb Matthews and Anna Hitchcock were married.³ **Anna Hitchcock** b(date unknown). Caleb Matthews and Ruth Merriam were married.³ **Ruth Merriam** b(date unknown).

8. **Elizabeth Matthews** (Elizabeth Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 6 Oct 1705 in New Haven, CT.³ She died on 17 Sep 1731 at the age of 25.³ She was buried in Hillside Cemetery, Cheshire, CT. Elizabeth Matthews and Amos Hotchkiss were married on 25 Feb 1731.¹¹ **Amos Hotchkiss**¹¹, son of John Hotchkiss and Mary Chatterton, b 27 Jun 1704 in New Haven, CT.¹¹ He died on 17 Jan 1773 at the age of 68 in Cheshire, CT.¹¹ Amos Hotchkiss and Elizabeth Matthews had the following child:

i. **Amos Hotchkiss** bSep 1730/1 in Cheshire, CT.¹¹ He died as infant.¹¹

9. **Esther Matthews** (Elizabeth Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1708.³ She d 1773 at the age of 65.³ Esther Matthews and Benjamin Lewis were married.³ **Benjamin Lewis** b(date unknown).

10. **Abel Matthews** (Elizabeth Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1710.³ He d 1789 at the age of 79.³ Abel Matthews and Mary Holt were married.³ **Mary Holt** b(date unknown).

11. **Abner Matthews** (Elizabeth Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1712.³ Abner Matthews and Lois Hotchkiss were married on 20 Jul 1735 in Wallingford, CT.¹² **Lois Hotchkiss** b 11 Jan 1717 in Wallingford, CT. She d Mar 1777 at the age of 60. She was buried in West Claremont Cemetery, NH. Abner Matthews and Lois Hotchkiss had the following child:

i. **Jesse Matthews** b 1736.

12. **Aaron Matthews** (Elizabeth Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1721.³ He d 1806 at the age of 85.³ Aaron Matthews and Huldah Frisbie were married.³ **Huldah Frisbie** b(date unknown).

13. **Esther Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b 1713 or 1717. She d Apr 1734 at the age of 21 in Cheshire, CT.

Esther Hotchkiss and Nathan Andrews were married on 20 Jan 1733 in Wallingford, CT. **Nathan Andrews**, son of Daniel Andrews and Mehitabel Cook, b 12 Jul 1714. He died about 1756 at the age of 42. Nathan Andrews and Esther Hotchkiss had the following child: i. **Amos Andrews** b 1734.

14. **Elizabeth Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b ca 1719. She d 1760 at the age of 41.

Elizabeth Hotchkiss and Ebenezer Bishop were married on 11 Aug 1742 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT. **Ebenezer Bishop** b 29 Jul 1710 in New Haven, CT. He died before 1778 at the age of 68. Ebenezer Bishop and Elizabeth Hotchkiss had the following children:

i. **Esther Bishop** b 3 Jul 1743 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT.

- 27 ii. **Ebenezer Bishop**, born 23 Nov 1746, New Haven, New Haven Co., CT; married Hannah Andrews; died 2 Jan 1794.
 iii. **Hannah Bishop** b 1748. She died young.
 iv. **Mary Bishop** b ca 1752. She d 1753 at the age of 1.
 28 v. **Joseph Bishop**, born 1757; married Olive Smith; died 1819.
 29 vi. **Experience Bishop**, born 1759; married Jabez Hitchcock; died 1843.

15. **Daniel Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b ca 1721 in New Haven, CT. He died on 13 Sep 1807 at the age of 86.

Daniel Hotchkiss and Mamre Cook were married about 1743/4. **Mamre Cook**, daughter of Ephraim Cook and Lydia Merriman, b 21 Dec 1723 in Wallingford, CT. Daniel Hotchkiss and Mamre Cook had the following child:

- 30 i. **Daniel Hotchkiss**, born 19 Aug 1744, Wallingford, New Haven Co., CT; married Sarah Smith; died 21 Jul 1827, Woodbridge, New Haven Co., CT.

16. **Susanna Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b ca 1722. Susanna Hotchkiss and Joel Parker were married on 25 Dec 1746 in Wallingford, CT. **Joel Parker**, son of Edward Parker and Jerusha Merriam, b 24 Feb 1723 in Woodbridge, CT. He died on 27 Dec 1761 at the age of 38 in Wallingford, CT. Joel Parker and Susanna Hotchkiss had the following children:

- 31 i. **Etheldred Parker**, born 1747; married Asa Bronson.
 ii. **Amos Parker** b 1749.
 32 iii. **Susanna Parker**, born 1752; married Ebenezer Bronson.
 iv. **Joel Parker** b 1754. He d 1776 at the age of 22.
 v. **Levi Parker** b(date unknown).
 33 vi. **Stephen Parker**, born 1759; married Sally Twiss; married Rebecca Ray Stone; died 1846.

17. **Solomon Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b ca 1724. He d Aug 1756 at the age of 32. He was buried in Middle Cemetery, Woodbridge, CT. Solomon Hotchkiss and Eleanor Perkins were married on 16 Dec 1748 in New Haven, CT. **Eleanor Perkins**, daughter of Seth Perkins and Elizabeth Munson, b 3 Sep 1726 in New Haven, CT. She died on 9 May 1816 at the age of 89. She was buried in Middle Cemetery, Woodbridge, CT.

18. **Eliphalet Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b 1 Nov 1727 in New Haven, CT. He died on 5 Jul 1803 at the age of 75 in Derby, CT. Eliphalet Hotchkiss and Comfort Harger were married on 26 Dec 1751 in Derby, CT. **Comfort Harger**, daughter of Jabez Harger and Ann Gilbert, b 10 Sep 1720 in Derby, CT. She died on 11 Mar 1802 at the age of 81 in Derby, CT.

19. **Obadiah Hotchkiss** (Daniel-2, Daniel-1) b 9 Apr 1731 in New Haven, CT. He died on 23 Mar 1805 at the age of 73. He was buried in Middle Cemetery, Woodbridge, CT. Obadiah Hotchkiss and Mercy Perkins were married on 16 Nov 1758 in New Haven, CT. **Mercy Perkins**, daughter of Daniel Perkins and Martha Elcock, b 30 Jan 1730/1 in New Haven, CT. She died on 14 Feb 1797 at the age of 66. She was buried in Middle Cemetery, Woodbridge, CT. Obadiah Hotchkiss and Mercy Perkins had the following children:

- 34 i. **Eli Hotchkiss**, born 18 Sep 1758, New Haven, CT; married Eunice Atwater, 24 Feb 1783, New Haven, CT; died 13 May 1813, New Haven, CT.

20. **Isaac Ives** (Rebecca Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1721.³ He d 1760 at the age of 39.³ Isaac Ives and Lydia Morgan were married. **Lydia Morgan**, daughter of Joseph Morgan and Susanna Morgan, b ca 1719. She died on 8 May 1793 at the age of 74 in Cheshire, CT. She was buried in Hillside Cemetery, Cheshire, CT. Isaac Ives and Lydia Morgan had the following child: 38 i.

John Ives, born 25 Dec 1748, Wallingford, CT; married Lois Hotchkiss, 1 Jan 1770, Wallingford, CT.

21. **Andrew Ives** (Rebecca Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1724.³ Andrew Ives and Sarah Prindle were married.³ **Sarah Prindle** b(date unknown).

22. **Enos Ives** (Rebecca Hotchkiss-2, Daniel-1) b 1727.³ Enos Ives and Ann Cook were married.³ **Ann Cook** b(date unknown).
