### Two Hotchkiss Brothers Find Each Other

I have a great story which happened about 2011. It is a story of two brothers who didn't know of each other's existence until I posted a query on the web. One was a child of the 60's whose parents never married. Ten years later, the he married and had a daughter and a son. He died very young when his son was just a newborn. He never got the chance to tell his children of the older brother.

My great grandfather and other family members lived in California and are buried in the local cemetery there. He had a brother who moved to Arizona and the family lost contact with him long ago. My great grandfather's brother died in Arizona, but is buried in the cemetery in California. His headstone engraving made me realize not only did he have at least one child, but grandchildren as well.

I posted information about the headstone online asking for anyone who was his descendant to please contact me. Six months later, I received a reply from a man I'd not heard of by the name of 'Jim' with a different surname. I asked logical questions to confirm his identity, but he never replied.

Another six months passed and I received a new message from a 'Scott'. He'd seen the question and 'Jim's' posting which really surprised him! This was a brother he knew nothing about! Scott lived in Washington state and contacted me. 'Jim' and 'Scott' met shortly thereafter. Each had the same physical features and were

wearing the same exact haircut and clothing. Scott's wife said it was unbelievable! I later met Scott, his wife and baby. We met in a restaurant parking lot, but I could tell from a long distance he belonged to us. He was totally a Hotchkiss in personality as well! I kept getting the giggles because I could connect things he said with others in the family. It still gives me goose bumps. We stay in touch.

Never underestimate what a few words can do on the internet. It was a blessing beyond words for both men. It was a time in both of their lives when finding a new brother was a real plus. I felt so honored to help bring these two together. Truly a miracle!

In the 1970's I lived only a few miles away from the business which belonged to these men's grandfather in Arizona. One day, driving by on the freeway, my husband noticed the name and asked if he was related to my grandmother. My response was probably, since there weren't many by that name in the region. Little did I know I would be tracking them down many years later.

*Editor's note: Your editor has personally researched Samuel, son of Samuel Hotchkiss, the Immigrant. I'm happy to share some additional information upon request. I am including a few notes Lieut. Samuel Hotchkiss. I welcome information you've collected on this line as well. Please list sources if you'd like to include it in future newsletters.*

A few notes about Lieut. Samuel Hotchkiss, 2nd son of Samuel.

At a Guilford Town meeting, 22 Feb 1668, it was voted to accept him as a planter, but it does not appear that he attended that meeting. Samuell Hotchkis [sic] is listed as a Proprietor of New Haven, CT in 1685. He resided in East Haven, founding that branch of the family. He was a carpenter by trade. When he d in January, 1705, his second wife, Hannah, was the administratrix of his will. His inventory amounted to £1705, showing him to be a man of some wealth.

An Inventory of the Estate of Lt. Samuel Hotchkiss late of New Haven... as it was taken and appraised by Capt Allin Ball and James Brady 27 Jan 1705. [a partial listing below]

9 £ 10 shillings wearing apparel; 6£ 14 shillings linen apparel 6£ 15 shillings; 2 horses, 2 mares; buttons, yarn, tobacco, books; carpentry tools, joyner, wheelwright, flax, spinning wheel; cows, sheep, pork, skillet, kettle, looking glass, 6 bushels of oats, 2 bushels of wheat. Estate mentions these names, it appears that these people may have purchased items in the inventory.

Thomas Barnes - this may have been his granddaughter, Abigail's father-in-law

Hannah Hotchkiss; Eliphalet Pardee—granddaughter Abigail m Eliphalet Pardee; Joseph Mouthrop; Joseph Grannis; Joshua Hotchkiss; Samuell Hotchkiss—may have been his son Samuel; Wm Bradley
